As you plan the overall design for your space, it's important to factor trims and moldings into the budget. They're a must-have for presenting a cohesive, completed look that functions the way you need it to.

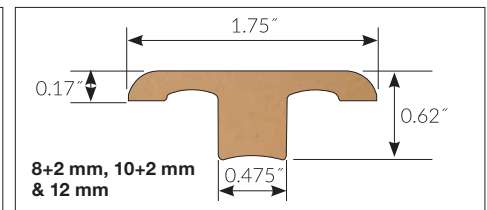
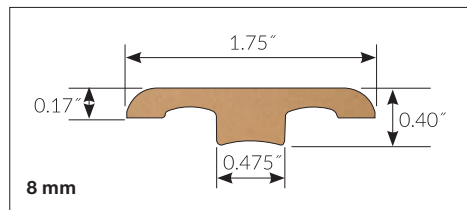

Your project may only require some of these pieces. Here's where and how each is used to complete a laminate flooring installation.

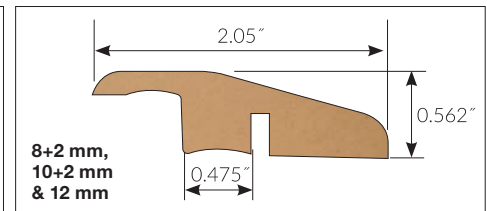
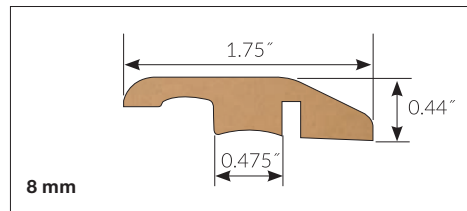
T-Molding

Used between floors of equal height.



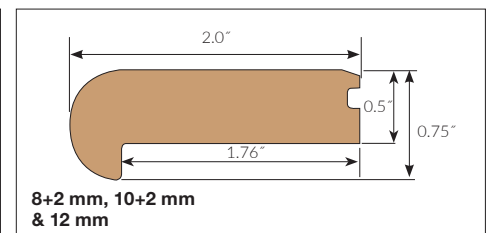
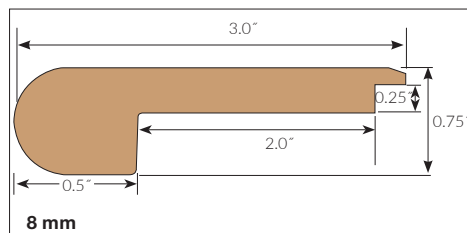
Multi-Purpose Reducer

Used between floors of unequal height or carpet.



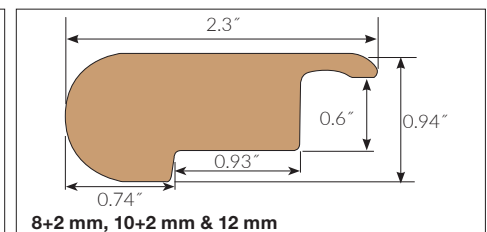
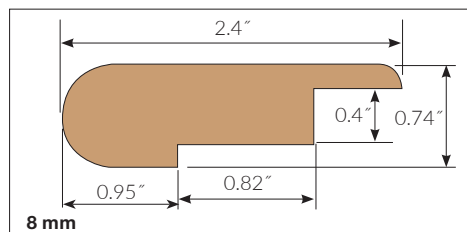
Flush Stair Nose

Finishes the end of a step.



Overlap Stair Nose

Finishes the end of a step.



Quarter Round

Covers the gap between the floor and wall.
